The April meeting of the Kuemper Catholic School Board was called to order by chairman Tom Brincks, on Tuesday, April 18, 2023, at 4:00 p.m. at the Kuemper High School Library. Administrators shared positive moments including the support for Then Feed Just One packing event which supplied over 150,000 meals. *Cinderella*, the musical, was a great success with a large turnout in attendance. Third grade students started a unit in finances and were mentored by local banks. The bank representatives said the students were very respectful.

Marketing & Enrollment

Erin Sundrup's written report stated next year's overall enrollment should increase. We continue to see a rise in enrollment in our younger grades. Discover Kuemper Preschool Night was a huge success. We received many positive comments. Computers were set up to register for preschool while having one-on-one time with teachers as families toured the facility. There are currently 86 preschool students registered for the 2023-2024 school year. Three year old preschool enrollment is increasing by 11, from 21 students in 22-23 to 32 students in 23-24. 83% of families have completed registration for next year.

Alumni/Annual Giving

Heather Pietig's written report stated the Kuemper Ball will be held at the Kuemper Fieldhouse on Saturday, April 29, 2023, from 5:30 P.M. to 12:30 P.M. Lidderdale will cater. Live music, live auction, and lots of fun! The ball booklet was finalized as of 4/13 so no other donation will be noted in the program. People are welcome to give and will be listed under the Ball Blitz Slide Show on the evening at the Kuemper Ball. Requests for alumni class reunion postcards and class lists are coming in steadily. We are looking forward to a great Homecoming weekend September 29, 2023.

Development/Fundraising – Foundation

Alan Loew's written report states the *Faith Forward...Building Excellence in Mind, Body, and Soul* Capital Campaign continues to receive gifts. To date (April 11, 2023), our campaign has received \$10,690,608.94 in gifts and pledges. Msgr. Lafferty's Tuition 2023 goal is \$836,127. As of March 31, Kuemper has raised \$48,419.00 (16 donors). In March 2022, \$114,210.84 was raised. There will be several new 2023-24 scholarships. The Father Jeff Schleisman Scholarships will award five \$500 annual scholarships to incoming freshman and four \$500 scholarships will be awarded to incoming reshmen by an anonymous donor.
